

BIOSECURITY GUIDELINES FOR LIVESTOCK PRODUCERS AND TRANSPORTERS

Biosecurity:

Protects animal, human, and business health
Minimizes disease movement within or onto an operation
Applies to anyone working with or near animals

Livestock Producers

- Create and follow a biosecurity plan with your herd veterinarian
- Post signs to inform haulers/transporters where to drive, load, or unload
- Isolate new animals from the home herd and watch for signs of disease
- Practice good hand hygiene

Haulers/Transporters

- Follow posted signs and biosecurity steps at the farm, ranch, or market
- Change soiled clothing, footwear before handling other animals
- Clean equipment used for hauling and handling livestock
- Practice good hand hygiene
